I come to the club with a background in obedience and showing and as a professional Dog handler and trainer with AQIS DDU. I was trained by the well-known Dog Trainer Steven Austin in Sydney NSW.

- 5. History of exercise on a hot day, being left unattended in a hot car, or unable to get out of the sun

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Can You Help?

Hello, my name is Veronika Czerwinski and I am a second year PhD student. My project is looking at maternal care in dogs and I am hoping you can help. In other species there is evidence that maternal care is associated with later responses to stress in adult life. This has not yet been documented in dogs. Stress and anxiety in dogs can reduce quality of life for both dog and owner. In my study I am analysing maternal behaviour, and a stress response test in young puppies. There are three main areas in this study:

To gather the data I mount a camera to film the whelping box area from when the puppies are born until they are 15 days old. This is to measure how often the dam is in the box, and licks and feeds the puppies. The camera runs continuously but the sound is switched off, and only the area inside the whelping box is filmed.

When the pups are approximately 7 weeks old (or just before they are rehomed) we isolate them for 5 minutes in a box and film their responses to compare how much they move around and vocalise. We will also make a loud noise and assess their response, and take a swab of saliva from their mouth to look for chemical measures of stress. Finally, we use a stethoscope to measure heart rate before and after the test. None of these tests are expected to cause pain or undue distress to the puppies- they may not be happy with the isolation but it is only a relatively short period of time.

I would also like the breeder to fill out a survey (the Canine Behavioral Assessment & Research Questionnaire) about the dam.

SNAKE BITE

The snakes most commonly found in our area are the Eastern Brown snake and the Red Bellied Black snake. These snakes are both highly dangerous to your pet with the brown snake being one of the deadliest snakes known to man. Your pet's survival depends on you being vigilant. Snake bite in dogs is one of those emergencies where time is of the utmost importance, so do not delay getting your dog to a vet if you have any suspicions, or there is any signs of snake bite. All too often over my nursing career I have had the odd client who has seen the dog with a snake and wants to sit and wait to see if any symptoms develop. In my experience, your pet should be taken to the vet immediately for monitoring as sadly by the time symptoms develop, the chance of your pet surviving snake bite has greatly diminished without immediate treatment.



Symptoms of snake bite:

- Acute onset vomiting, salivation, urination, defecation, muscle tremors,
- shallow respiration,
- hind limb weakness
- collapsing +/- vomiting and then gets up and walks away (pre-paralytic sign)

What to do if your pet is displaying any of the listed symptoms:

- **Get your dog to veterinary assistance immediately** (even if you are unsure that it is snake bite it's better to have the dog at the veterinary clinic) If symptoms progress they will progress very quickly your pet will have a better chance at survival if at a veterinary clinic.
- Limit movement as much as you can if this means you have to carry the dog or bring transport to them do so. Movement increases the speed and spread of the toxin to major organs.
- Keep your pet calm It's important that you also stay calm. Remember, your pet picks up on your stress and will also become more stressed.
- If it's a hot day, keep your pet cool with plenty of air flow around them to reduce panting. We want them to remain as clam as possible.

As with anything, safe guarding is better than cure and as a pet owner there are a few precautions you can take to minimize your pet's risk of snake bite

- Dogs love water however it's advisable not to allow them wander around in long grass near river and water areas.
- Keep your pet's yard clear of long grass, wood piles and leaf matter.
- Avoid your dog walking at dusk or early morning off leash in long grass snakes are exothermic
- Use snake repellers or bird netting on your fence line borders. This helps to keep snakes out of certain areas but will in no way be 100%.

Always keep a watchful eye on what your dog is getting up to.

Vet Assistance:

Time! Is of the utmost importance so if your pet is displaying the symptoms of snake bite, get them to the closet vet clinic. Download the following app and keep it on your phone - if you are traveling or out for the day, this gives you the location of your closet vet as well as first aid tips for all types of emergencies.

Search for - First Aid for Pets (Australia) in your app store. Simply download from there into your smart phone.

Snake Facts:

As much as they can be scary, being sensible in how we live and deal with them is important. Snakes do not attack humans, dogs or cats. They would prefer to slither away and be left alone. Remember, dogs and cats usually only get bitten because they have decided it would be a good idea to hunt and attack the snake. Dogs will often see the snake as either something that should not be in their yard or a play toy. Either way, often the snake is too quick for most dogs. Some dogs will have a natural respect and will just bark and carry on alerting the owner to go and investigate. Remove the pets from the area and then call a snake catcher to remove the snake. Snakes are a reptile, which means they are exothermic: they get their body heat from external sources. A snake's body temperature - and so its level of activity - is controlled by the temperature of the air and the ground. It will try to maximise body heat by basking in the sun or lying on or near warm surfaces. It's important to understand this as it gives us pet owners a better indication of when snakes are likely to be more active hence the comment about the time of day you need to be vigilant when walking or exercising your dogs. Snakes will not be found moving about when the temperature is extremely hot or cold. They will usually go to somewhere cooler when temperature goes over 32 degrees and leave their hunting and moving around till either morning or evening when the temperature is right for them to be able to hunt, eat and move. Often this is when man, snake and dog meet as often pet owners we walk our dogs at about that time in summer to also avoid the heat. So at this time of the day it's strongly suggested to keep your dogs on leash or exercise in an area that is clear and you can visibly see the ground were your pet is running.

GROUND RULES

These rules apply to all handlers during training sessions and have been formulated for the welfare of you and your dog.

Any Club member, or any person guilty of unseemly conduct or acts harmful to the club, may be asked to leave the Training area. They may also be dealt with by the Committee of The GSDC of S A Inc. under clause 6, and relative by-laws of the Clubs Constitution.

Any dog which is sick WILL NOT be permitted onto the Club grounds.

Dogs who have suffered a CONTAGIOUS DISEASE WILL NOT be allowed on to the grounds until 5 weeks after being cleared by a veterinarian (a vets certificate may be required). Puppies should not be brought out onto the Club grounds under the age of 8 weeks or at least 2 weeks after they have been inoculated for HEPATITIS, DISTEMPER AND PARVOVIRUS (vaccination certificate may be required).

Bitches in season are not permitted on the grounds unless at a recognised Club event.

The use of switches, spiked collars or whips is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN ON THE CLUB GROUNDS.

Members shall not treat their dog in a manner which may reflect badly on the Club.

Dogs are NOT to be taken off-lead or left unattended, except on the directives, or under the supervision of a Class Instructor.

The handlers of dogs which foul the Club grounds, will be responsible for cleaning up same, with the equipment provided.

The Head Instructor has the authority to permit the use of a muzzle or training devices, as required in special cases. The use of the equipment is to be under supervision, and its use on the grounds, other than above, is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

Dogs under the age of 12 months ARE NOT permitted to use jump equipment higher than 400 mm, or longer than 800 mm.

Pursuant of the Health act "Dogs" ARE NOT permitted inside the Clubrooms. In the interest of safety and health, and in consideration of others, parents are required to super-vise the behaviour of their children. The Clubrooms and Toilets MUST NOT be used as playing areas.

In the interests of public health the Clubrooms and the verandah area are NON-SMOKING areas.

TRAINING HEAT POLICY If the forecast temperature is predicted to be 38 degrees or above on channel 9 weather at 6pm the night before training, (Wednesday nights or Sunday's), all training will be cancelled.

Appropriate foot wear must be worn at ALL times when handling / double handling dogs on the Club grounds. Bare feet, thongs, slip on shoes, high heels, sandals or crocs are not suitable foot wear and members wearing any of the above will be asked to leave the training area.
