
Editorial

Why not to Shave Your Dog!

A double-coated breed dog's hair is designed to protect him from the elements.



"Double-coated" breeds have a shiny topcoat of guard hairs over a softer, denser undercoat. The Siberian Husky, German Shepherd Dog and Golder Retriever are double-coated breeds. Minimal-shedding dogs like the Poodle, Maltese, and Shih Tzu are not.

The closer a dog's coat is to the wild type (ie. short, straight, and dense like a wolf's coat), the more dramatically he will shed and the less prone to matting he will be. In that case, regular grooming will help keep excess hair from taking over your house.

The less wolf-like his coat is, the more grooming a dog will require to remove loose hair and prevent matting.

in warm weather ...

a dry, fluffed, tangle-free coat traps a layer of cool air to help insulate the dog against overheating.

Undercoat hairs shed out and re-grow several times per year. Guard hairs shed out and re-grow once every few years.

- A double-coat overdue for grooming:
- * appears lumpy and rough
- * can't trap air for insulation
- * can't repel moisture or dry quickly

- * traps dirt and debris
 * provides a good hiding place for bugs
 * encourages the overgrowth of bacteria and fungus that can create painful sores
- * traps hair as it sheds, making the situation
- increasingly worse over time

Professional bathing and brushing can help keep your pet beautiful and comfortable year 'round!

In extreme cases, when a dog is too matted to brush out humanely, the best option is to clip him short. For your pet's health and comfort, a properly groomed, natural coat is best, but a shaved coat is better than a matted coat

After a short shave:

The coat's appearance will be dominated by undercoat:

- * fewer, lighter colors
- * dull instead of shiny
- * softer, finer hairs

Without a proper double-coat, steps should be taken to minimize the dog's exposure to sunlight, heat, and extreme cold due to increased risk for:

- * sunburn and heat stroke
- * hypothermia and frostbite

The coat will still need regular brushing to maintain a normal shed cycle, but the hairs will be much shorter for several months.





Before shaving your double-coated dog, some potential long-term ramifications to consider:

Compared to undercoat, guard hairs shed and grow back slowly. It can take a year or more to regrow a topcoat.

ing can sometimes interfere with the shedding cycle, resulting in a higher proportion of undercoat compared to guard hair regrowth. More undercoat means the coat will shed more and mat faster.

Shaving a double-coated dog can reveal or cause permanent coat damage, hair loss, and bald spots in some dogs, especially if they are not brushed regularly while they are growing out. Frequent shaving over time increases the likelihood that coat texture and thickness will change in an undesireable way.

Dogs and their coats are unique and respond to shaving differently. The information provided here is meant to help you make informed choices for your double-coated dog's hair care but is in no way specific to your situation. Your groomer will be happy to evaluate your dog's coat and speak to you about your best grooming options.



Ground Rules



These rules apply to all handlers during training sessions and have been formulated for the welfare of you and your dog.

Any Club member, or any person guilty of unseemly conduct or acts harmful to the club, may be asked to leave the Training area. They may also be dealt with by the Committee of The GSDC of S A Inc. under clause 6, and relative by-laws of the Clubs Constitution.

Any dog which is sick WILL NOT be permitted onto the Club grounds.

Dogs who have suffered a CONTAGIOUS DISEASE WILL NOT be allowed on to the grounds until 5 weeks after being cleared by a veterinarian (a vets certificate may be re-quired). Puppies should not be brought out onto the Club grounds under the age of 8 weeks or at least 2 weeks after they have been inoculated for HEPATITIS, DISTEMPER AND PARVOVIRUS (vaccination certificate may be required).

Bitches in season are not permitted on the grounds unless at a recognised Club event.

The use of switches, spiked collars or whips is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN ON THE CLUB GROUNDS.

Members shall not treat their dog in a manner which may reflect badly on the Club.

Dogs are NOT to be taken off-lead or left unattended, except on the directives, or under the supervision of a Class Instructor.

The handlers of dogs which foul the Club grounds, will be responsible for cleaning up same, with the equipment provided.

The Head Instructor has the authority to permit the use of a muzzle or training devices, as required in special cases. The use of the equipment is to be under supervision, and its use on the grounds, other than above, is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

Dogs under the age of 12 months ARE NOT permitted to use jump equipment higher than 400 mm, or longer than 800 mm.

Pursuant of the Health act "Dogs" ARE NOT permitted inside the Clubrooms.

In the interest of safety and health, and in consideration of others, parents are required to super-vise the behaviour of their children. The Clubrooms and Toilets MUST NOT be used as playing areas.

Training Extreme Weather Policy

Training will be cancelled if the forecast temperature for West Beach is predicted to be 37 degrees or above or an Extreme Storm warning is issued on www.eldersweather.com.au at 6pm the night before training (Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings).

Appropriate foot wear must be worn at ALL times when handling / double handling dogs on the Club grounds. Bare feet, thongs, slip on shoes, high heels, sandals or crocs and shoes with metal-spiked soles are not suitable foot wear and members wearing any of the above will be asked to leave the training area.
