Wishing ALL members and their Families a Merry Christmas, a Safe and Prosperous New Year.



Treasurers Report for 2020-2021 Financial Year German Shepherd Dog Club of South Australia

This is the tenth financial report that I have the pleasure in presenting to the members. As always I would like to thank all the other members of committee that I worked with during the year, who dutifully kept all receipts for expenses, and made out receipts for income received. Without this cooperation it is would be very difficult to do the Treasurer's job.

The financial statements have been prepared mainly on a cash basis. The only accrual entries are: (1) 2021/22 membership fees which have been posted to Deferred Revenue in the Balance Sheet (amount = \$3,984); and (2) dog food on hand at the end of the year to inventory for \$2,097.

Debtors of \$300 were for Falcon GT Club which paid the account on 8/10/2021. Creditors of \$2150.28 were made up of \$1214.28 for DogsSA for show levies etc: and \$936 for the German Shepherd Dog Council of Australia for HD/ED forms. Both of these were paid for in October 2021. Other Liabilities of \$4989.95 is due to club receiving a grant from the West Torrens City Council which obliges us to purchase a Defibrillator and provide training.

The Balance Sheet shows that our overall cash position increased by \$18,287.55 with an overall cash balance at the end of the financial year of \$43,218.76 which is a sound position for the club. The main reason for the cash increase is the council grant received and the financial performance of the club. Net Surplus for the year was \$7,745.61 which compares to a Surplus in the prior year of \$2880.20 which is an improvement of \$4,865.41.

The major contributors to the surplus were the profits from the Shepherd Shop = \$10,822.63 and the canteen = \$1,951.08.

I also note that the club earned \$1,540 by manning the DogsSA canteen during the year. Thankyou to all those members who volunteered their time.

Overall a pleasing result for the club.

While the 50th National Show and Trial has been pushed out to 2024 which we will host we still need to be much more active in fundraising activities if we want to make the event the best ever.

The club held four Obedience Trials and one Endurance Test this year. No Agility trials were held this year as we did not have access to the equipment needed so an obedience trial was held in its place.

30 May 2021 The Annual Balmead Shield Trial

Dover Gardens Kennel and Obedience Dog Club and Para Districts Obedience Dog Club. The winner of the Shield was, Para Districts with an impressive total score of 559. Dover Gardens second with a total score of 309. Congratulations to the team members, Lyn Carroll with 'Stryker', James Wissell with 'Blitz', Karen Moralee with 'Amelia' and Chrissy Dalla Valle with 'Jess' as reserve. Thank you to the Judge, Mr Neil MacDonald for officiating in the Balmead Ring.

3 July 2021 Obedience Trial

Unfortunately, due to illness, I was unable to attend this event. I sincerely thank, Gillian Smith, Judy and Andrew O'Loughlin, Joe Seidl, Stephen Collins and of course, President, John for making sure that the day ran smoothly and also for the pre- trial set up.

We had an impressive total of 52 entries. The day was very cold with some rain but nonetheless, ran very smoothly.

1 August 2021 Obedience Trial

This trial was on the heels of a seven day lockdown in South Australia due to a Covid outbreak. After consultation with SAPOL, the Covid Hotline and Dogs SA, it was deemed that if we followed the club's Covid Safe Plan and adhered to SA Health restrictions, the trial could go ahead.

The trial had a great entry of 63 competitors and we had 10 scratchings on the day. The weather was kind to us given the amount of rain the day before. Big thanks to our judges on the day, Neil MacDonald, Jan Brabham, Tony Brennan and Anne Twaddle, thank you also to the stewards who did a great job in ensuring the trial ran smoothly.

14 August 2021 Endurance Test

The ET commenced at 8.00am and the weather conditions were perfect. We had a total of 9 entries with the breed represented being, GSD LSC, Samoyed, Belgian Shepherd (Malinois), Labrador, Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever, Whippet, Jack Russell Terrier. Unfortunately, four of the exhibitors failed the ET so we had a total of 5 passes.

The ET was once again judged by our own, Mr Brian Fielder who cycled the course with the competitors. The veterinary surgeon was, Dr Neil Thies (BVSc (Hons) MAVS) from Willunga Vet Services who has officiated as Vet at our ET trials for over 20 years. Dr. Thies has always jogged the 20km long ET and did so again this year. Our Pace Setter was, Wayne O'Loughlin who cycled the course leading the competitors and ensuring a consistent speed and time were kept. Wayne has also helped at our ET trials for many years now. Our two - time keepers - were, Gillian Smith and Bon Jordan who ensured that each section of the test and rest breaks were timed. Gillian was also our SACA Rep. Our assistants on the day were, Judy O'Loughlin, John De Lucia and myself.

28 August 2021 Obedience Trial

This trial saw an entry of 51 competitors. Once again, we were very lucky with perfect weather conditions. Breed Survey Registrar SA - Annual Report 2021

During the year, 2021, the club held four breed surveys with a total of 26 animals presented which included one fail.

Survey Date	10/10/2021	x 5 (including 1 x fail)

The total number of animals presented increased by one, compared to 2020 which had a total of 25 animals presented.

It would be appreciated if members who present animals to survey, provide clear and legible paperwork as sometimes, hand written forms or poorly scanned copies of original paper work can be hard to read.

In an attempt to remind owners to submit a colour photograph of their animal to the NBC Registrar, I have started giving out printed slips of paper that are given to owners on the day with details of where to send their photo to. It is helpful to have a photo of the animal when researching animals on the GSDCA Database and is also a requirement of Survey.

I congratulate the owners for presenting their animals to survey and participating in this very important breed improvement scheme.
