The following day, Sunday 9 was the annual puppy day which saw a great turn out with 29 puppies. Lunch was provided by the club and thank you to those of you who brought along a salad to share.

We have started to implement some improvements to the grounds with the first being a cement edging by the roller doors out the back to make it easy to get equipment and other items in and out of the shed.

With the warmer weather now upon us it is a good idea to walk your dogs in the cool of the morning or later in the evening and make sure they have plenty of fresh water. DON'T leave dogs in locked vehicles and also be cautious of grass seeds as they can be very harmful and nasty to your dog. Regular grooming of your dogs and checking their coat and skin is vital.

RESEARCH VITAL FOR GERMAN SHEPHERD IMPORTS



When considering bloodlines and expanding your kennel to breed to the German Shepherd Dog standard some breeders have considered importing proven dogs.

Lago German Shepherds owner Mr Salvatore Pittelli, Adelaide, has been breeding dogs for 20 years and in his time has imported four dogs.

Mr Pittelli says when you first consider importing you should research the dog you like then approach the breeders.

"You most definitely have to go and see the dog," he says.

"You should make the trip overseas to have a look at the dog physically unless you trust the person really well.

"From then you get the process going by getting a rabies neutralising antibody titre (RNAT) which is a blood sample.

"The rabies test is important to start the process for quarantine."

Mr Pittelli said the day the RNAT sample is processed and the permit is approved, quarantine of 180 days begins for the dog.

"The breeder should source the RNAT on the buyer's request otherwise the dog cannot leave," he said.

"Once you have the results you send the results to the Australian Government - you can get the declaration form from the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Water online - and lodge an application to import to the department and pay a fee for your import."

RESEARCH VITAL FOR GERMAN SHEPHERD IMPORTS (Cont.)



Mr Pittelli said all the paperwork has to be dealt with by an Australian Government approved veterinarian which will undertake a 10-step check on the animal in its residing country.

"If the dog resides in Italy, the breeder of the dog has to take the animal to get it's blood samples to an Australian Government approved vet, not just any vet," he said.

"Then, 45 days before the dog leaves the country, the dog has to undergo another test for different illnesses.

"Then, 15 days before departure a final test is done to check for parasites."

"If the dog is given the all clear then the dog embarks on its journey to arrive here and has a 10 day quarantine period which once complete, you have your dog."

Mr Pittelli said the importing process can happen within six months however if someone has a dog for sale and it was meant to be imported elsewhere having undergone it's RNAT, the dog could be in Australia in 24 hours with the requirement of 10 days quarantine.

"From the day the breeder has done the RNAT, it is good to go without another test for two years," he says.

"The quarantine requirement is that the dog needs to be 4 months of age minimum so you can bring in a pup but for a breeder you wouldn't want to bring in a pup.

"If you want a dog - it's a fairly expensive exercise.

"It is not just the guarantine fees - that's nothing, it's like \$3,500 - the expense is the freight.

"It could be from \$5,000 to \$7,000 so why would you spend \$5,000 to \$7,000 to bring in a pup?"

Mr Pittelli posed the question, as a breeder from a breeding prospect - why would you bring in something that could fail after the expense you've gone through?

"You should always make sure you have had the hips and elbow scoring done in the animal's residing country and you may as well wait to have its breed survey as well," he says.

"You could bring a dog here that's gun shy ... and there's all your investment gone.

"It's a huge investment where you can spend up to \$100,000 - it depends on the dog you buy."





RESEARCH VITAL FOR GERMAN SHEPHERD IMPORTS (Cont.)



Mr Pittelli says his message to anyone who would consider importing is it is very important to try and look into the correctness and health of the dog.

"You want to match it as close to the breed standard as you can get," he said.

"You don't want a dog that's not good in the head also, it could pass it on genetically to it's progeny.

"You want a healthy dog, in body and mind - it's very important.

"When researching a dog for import you should be looking to see if the dog has got IPO/IGP testing which is a working dog title looking at the behaviour of the dog and obedience."

Mr Pittelli says they test the correctness of the dog from a young age and the idea is that when you bring the dog here, it has all its testing to minimise problems.

"Dog shows are good but IPO really tests the dogs," he says.

"IGP1 is the start of the training, IGP2 and IGP3 means the dog has done more advanced training."


The Australian Government stipulates a timeframe of 7 months on imports as it can take up to 180 days for an animal infected with the rabies virus to show signs of the disease and 21 days for processing of applications.

I enjoy my role as president and working with a dedicated team of committee members in ensuring that our club provides the best facilities and training for German Shepherd Dogs in this state.


I have a great passion for the breed and enjoy meeting new people and welcome you to contact me to discuss any matters of interest to you.

We Joined South Australian Canine Association (Dogs SA) in 1975 and registered the RHOSYN prefix. That same year we bred our first litter.


I have been a member of the committee for more than thirty years and have held most positions.

The search began for a good breeder and we found Babenburg Kennels through contacting the GSDCSA.


I arranged a visit to the kennels where we met Jenny De Lucia, who interviewed us and then took us to meet the puppies.

I retired in July 2021 and moved to Lyndoch. It is a bit of a long drive but, worth it.



GROUND RULES



These rules apply to all handlers during training sessions and have been formulated for the welfare of you and your dog.

Any Club member, or any person guilty of unseemly conduct or acts harmful to the club, may be asked to leave the Training area.

They may also be dealt with by the Committee of The GSDC of S A Inc. under clause 6, and relative bylaws of the Clubs Constitution.

Any dog which is sick WILL NOT be permitted onto the Club grounds.

Dogs who have suffered a CONTAGIOUS DISEASE WILL NOT be allowed on to the grounds until 5 weeks after being cleared by a veterinarian (a vets certificate may be required).

Puppies should not be brought out onto the Club grounds under the age of 8 weeks or at least 2 weeks after they have been inoculated for HEPATITIS, DISTEMPER AND PARVOVIRUS (vaccination certificate may be required).

Bitches in season are not permitted on the grounds unless at a recognised Club event. The use of switches, spiked collars or whips is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN ON THE CLUB GROUNDS.

Members shall not treat their dog in a manner which may reflect badly on the Club. Dogs are NOT to be taken off-lead or left unattended, except on the directives, or under the supervision of a Class Instructor.

The handlers of dogs which foul the Club grounds, will be responsible for cleaning up same, with the equipment provided. The Head Instructor has the authority to permit the use of a muzzle or training devices, as required in special cases. The use of the equipment is to be under supervision, and its use on the grounds, other than above, is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

Dogs under the age of 12 months ARE NOT permitted to use jump equipment higher than 400 mm, or longer than 800 mm.

Pursuant of the Health act "Dogs" ARE NOT permitted inside the Clubrooms. In the interest of safety and health, and in consideration of others, parents are required to supervise the behaviour of their children. The Clubrooms and Toilets MUST NOT be used as playing areas.

In the interests of public health the Clubrooms and the verandah area are NON-SMOKING areas.

Training Extreme Weather Policy Training will be cancelled if the forecast temperature for West Beach is predicted to be 37 degrees or above or an Extreme Storm warning is issued on www.eldersweather.com.au at 6pm the night before training (Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings).

Appropriate foot wear must be worn at ALL times when handling / double handling dogs on the Club grounds. Bare feet, thongs, slip on shoes, high heels, sandals or crocs and shoes with metal-spiked soles are not suitable foot wear and members wearing any of the above will be asked to leave the training area.
