Dear Lyn

German Shepherd Dog - Intervariety Breeding

Reference is made to your letter of 6 March 2022 requesting a change to Regulations Part 6 - The Register & Registration Clause 9.19.2 regarding intervariety breeding of German Shepherd Dog Stock Coat and Long Stock Coat.

We are pleased to advise the National Canine Health & Wellbeing Committee recommendation to endorse your request was supported at our June 2022 Special Board meeting. Our Directors agreed a review is to be undertaken by the German Shepherd Dog Council (Australia) commencing five years after the implementation date.

We are currently arranging for Regulations Part 6 - The Register & Registration Clause 9.19.2 to be amended as follows:

9.19.2 Inter-variety breeding will be allowed for a period of seven years from 1 January 2023, and progeny from parents of either coat variety may be registered on Main and Limited Register under the appropriate coat variety until further notice. (06/22, 4.2)

We note in your letter that amendment to the Breed Standard Extension (BSE) will also be required. Please find attached a copy of the 2012 document and we ask that you arrange for it to be amended accordingly and returned as soon as possible so we can arrange for our website to be updated.

The thoughts of a New-Bee

As many of you are aware, I'm very new to owning a German Shepherd and being part of the GS community, so my thoughts are from that perspective and not an expert, far from it.

My journey started in Adelaide at 4AM Saturday morning, in order to catch the 6AM flight to Sydney. Then came the hire car and further journey of well over an hour, getting to the show venue around 10am. I then enjoyed two days in heaven, where there was nothing but GS puppies, up to the big boys and girls as far as my eyes could see.

I quickly managed to catch up with John, Jenny & Stephen (President, First Vice President, Secretary) and later Peter (Treasurer). The venue was very good and plenty of space at the Hawksbury Showground and while Adelaide had awful weather, the National had bright sunshine most of the time.

Being new to the show and trial world, I was very conscious of my actions and kept my thoughts to myself, but it was most certainly an interesting experience just watching and listening to people around the show ring. I did feel like a puppy following John, Stephen and Jenny around, so tried my best to disappear to give them space to do their thing from time to time.

They were all very patient with me and answering what to them must have been very silly and basic questions, for example: "Stephen, why is the judge shouting "no second handling", I can only see one handler in the ring?"

I did at one point collect enough courage on the second day to say to Jenny: "I do like that dog" for Jenny to then reply, "why is that", to which I said "it looks beautiful", and she said 'go on'. Well, I had not option then to try and analyse why I said that, "to me it has a beautiful face full of character, he has beautiful dark colouring and moves really well, I just love him, he's got bags of personality, but I know nothing to be fair"! Jenny was very polite and just said "hummm, interesting, ok". It turns out, the dog took 1st place, I did choose another on the previous day in a different group and discussed it with Stephen at length, that dog came 5th.

I have to say I found it fun and immensely informative, after watching and talking to both Jenny and Stephen as the competition handlers walked their GS around the arena listening to Jenny and Stephen and me interrupting with my questions. Plus, I tried to get too close to listen to the judges detailed critique at the end of each group/class.

I found it often enlightening to a new guy like myself, plus more questions for Jenny and Stephen.

I did feel very privileged to have two highly experienced, kind people in Jenny and Stephen sharing their immense knowledge with me and not to mention Peter who, although busy with his GS also took time to answer and help me understand. Congratulations to Peter handling an Open Bitch to gain the Silver medal.

During both Saturday and Sunday, I also spent a little time with John our president, and got to meet various members of the GSDCA executive committee and representatives from around Australia and overseas. The GSDCA executive committee were very hard working and conscientious people, putting in many hours to bring off this excellent show. Numerous awards were presented including one to Police Dog 'Kronos' for their outstanding work and commitment to the community.

I took a very keen interest in the obedience class on the Sunday and was observing a lady and her dog practicing about an hour prior to the final. I believe they had won their class and was now in the run off against several other class winners! The two (dog and handler) were a very impressive team. The sharpness of the reaction to the commands (hand only) by the dog were instant and a magnificent sight to behold. The dog did not put a paw wrong, I was super impressed, especially with the noise and distractions in close proximity while they were practising. An hour flew by and they entered the ring first. Judge gave the commands, right -turn-left -turn, sit, figure 8 pattern, all on point. Then right about turn and it all went wrong, the dog walked slow and then just stopped and sniffed the grass. I could not believe it. Never would I have thought that would or could happen. Then, I inwardly smiled to myself thinking about me and 'Rollo' (my 18month old GS) on a Sunday morning or at graduation. At home so much goes really well, then at graduation or on class day things go to pot, he loses concentration or something puts him off, or I'm stressed.

No longer, will I get stressed, it happens to champions, I've seen it at Cruft's and now at the GS National. The lady left the arena then hugged her GS and she smiled, laughed and hugged the dog again and shrugged her shoulders. So, why should I get stressed or upset if things don't work out in that moment? It doesn't matter, the dog doesn't know they are at a National competition or training in the park. I take my hat off to her, she was a true champion and ambassador for GSDCA the way she handled the whole disappointment.

The winner and 2nd place obedience were very different in style one fast, sharp with the dog very close to the handler. The other (and winner of Gold) was slower, controlled, methodical and dog about a hand width away from the handler, a very worthy winner. The standard was superb, handler and dog in true harmony and control, so glad I made the effort to get to watch it.

I'm really looking forward to next year when it is hosted in Melbourne.

GROUND RULES

These rules apply to all handlers during training sessions and have been formulated for the welfare of you and your dog.

Any Club member, or any person guilty of unseemly conduct or acts harmful to the club, may be asked to leave the Training area.

They may also be dealt with by the Committee of The GSDC of S A Inc. under clause 6, and relative bylaws of the Clubs Constitution.

Any dog which is sick WILL NOT be permitted onto the Club grounds.

Dogs who have suffered a CONTAGIOUS DISEASE WILL NOT be allowed on to the grounds until 5 weeks after being cleared by a veterinarian (a vets certificate may be required).

Puppies should not be brought out onto the Club grounds under the age of 8 weeks or at least 2 weeks after they have been inoculated for HEPATITIS, DISTEMPER AND PARVOVIRUS (vaccination certificate may be required).

Bitches in season are not permitted on the grounds unless at a recognised Club event. The use of switches, spiked collars or whips is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN ON THE CLUB GROUNDS.

Members shall not treat their dog in a manner which may reflect badly on the Club. Dogs are NOT to be taken off-lead or left unattended, except on the directives, or under the supervision of a Class Instructor.

The handlers of dogs which foul the Club grounds, will be responsible for cleaning up same, with the equipment provided. The Head Instructor has the authority to permit the use of a muzzle or training devices, as required in special cases. The use of the equipment is to be under supervision, and its use on the grounds, other than above, is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

Dogs under the age of 12 months ARE NOT permitted to use jump equipment higher than 400 mm, or longer than 800 mm.

Pursuant of the Health act "Dogs" ARE NOT permitted inside the Clubrooms. In the interest of safety and health, and in consideration of others, parents are required to supervise the behaviour of their children. The Clubrooms and Toilets MUST NOT be used as playing areas.

In the interests of public health the Clubrooms and the verandah area are NON-SMOKING areas.

Training Extreme Weather Policy Training will be cancelled if the forecast temperature for West Beach is predicted to be 37 degrees or above or an Extreme Storm warning is issued on www.eldersweather.com.au at 6pm the night before training (Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings).

Appropriate foot wear must be worn at ALL times when handling / double handling dogs on the Club grounds. Bare feet, thongs, slip on shoes, high heels, sandals or crocs and shoes with metal-spiked soles are not suitable foot wear and members wearing any of the above will be asked to leave the training area.
