ATTENTION MEMBERS CLUBS

GSDCA - FUTURE DIRECTION

I would like to give you a brief summary of the WUSV Harmonization Program that Germany insist we apply if we are to continue our WUSV membership and SV judges judging in Australia, awarding the Excellent grading.

Please be advised the Harmonization Program was first presented to the GSDCA in 2016 and the regulations regarding the Excellent grading commenced in 2020 although the current Executive was not aware of this until a meeting was held with Continental Director, Ms Heather McDonald in 2021.

Many reports have been published on Facebook over the last few weeks regarding a letter of agreement between the WUSV and the WGSDCA.

This agreement between the WUSV and the WGSDCA whilst not surprising, formalises an agreement between the two that has in fact been in place for quite some time.

Basic Level

- Microchip or tattoo we already do this.
- 2. DNA verified in storage this is a German SV system to be sent to Germany at the cost of the breeder
- HD hips are to be x-rayed and certified according to SV requirements meaning done by SV
 accredited vets and sent to Germany for reading and/or having our readers SV accredited.
- ED elbows are to be x-rayed and certified according to SV requirements meaning done by SV accredited vets and sent to Germany for reading and/or having our readers SV accredited.
- Prohibition of inbreeding 1/1, 1-2, 2-1, 2/3, 3/2
- 6. Character Test SV approved to be passed under an SV recognized character test judge.
- Breed Evaluation minimum good grading required.
- 8. Breeding Males must be over 24 months of age
- Breeding Females must be over 20 months of age
- 10. Maximum studs 60 in country of domiciled plus 30 other countries
- 11. Number of litters for females 3 litters in 24 months. This is outside Australian guidelines.
- Quality X-ray males to be re x-rayed after 30 studs

Advanced – all of the above PLUS

- Companion Dog Examination BH trial
- 2. Endurance Test ET
- Breed Suitability test SV ZAP or IGP-ZTP
- 4. Breed Permission

Premium - all the above PLUS

- Trial Examination Minimum requirement IPG1, SV-ZAP 1 & 2, HGH and RH2 or an equally recognized examination under a judge recognized by the WUSV National member club.
- Defence work at breed survey
- Breed Permission report required

SOME OTHER DEMANDS AND RESTRAINTS

We have also been alerted to the fact that our Breed Surveyors would need to be accredited by German examiners.

The WUSV has stipulated that an ANKC title discipline will not be sufficient to obtain an Excellent grading. We will be required to enhance an ANKC discipline to create a discipline that displays the dog's working capabilities. That created discipline will need to be endorsed by the WUSV.

The WUSV does not support any AI practices, and this would terminate our ability in Australia to access international bloodlines without buying the dog.

We have also been advised that there is no guarantee that the demands will not increase or change, leaving us with an uncertain future for compliance.

GSDCA plan and future direction

- Microchip already in place for 10 years now no change
- DNA this is being developed via the ANKC and other companies and Dog associations and will be looked at in the future to use an Australian system.
- HD we have an excellent scheme in place and no change is required. We have data from the last 40
 years, this history is vital information for our breeders it also shows the massive improvements over the
 years.
- ED we have an excellent scheme in place and no change is required. In fact we had an elbow scheme
 in place well before Germany and our improvements over the years has been amazing.
- 5. ANKC have breeding rules in place and we are governed by these.
- ZAP will remain on a voluntary basis
- No change to our breed surveys.
- ANKC have breeding rules in place in relation to our breeding males and we are governed by these.
- ANKC have breeding rules in place in relation to our breeding females and we are governed by these.
- We will not be placing a limit of studs on males
- ANKC have breeding rules in place in relation to number of litters per females and we are governed by these.
- We will not be re x-raying stud dogs

- Australia is a large country and AI insemination is an important part of improving the bloodlines to all
 parts of the country.
- 14. A list of NON-SV Judges from various countries is presently being compiled and will be forwarded to Member clubs shortly. This will be a list of highly qualified specialist judges that will award Excellent grading under the GSDCA schemes.

Future Nationals

- A complete new list of National approved judges will be compiled and distributed.
- 2. Rules and Regs will be updated to suit the new direction of the GSDCA

COMMUNICATION AND ADVICE

The GSDCA wishes to remind all club members that the ANKC does not allow participation in unauthorised activities and that doing so may place their ongoing membership of state controlling bodies at risk and the participant liable to penalties.

Members are also reminded that they should check the legislation in their state as several states have legislation in place that makes it illegal to participate in several areas of canine activity and to do so would render the member liable to criminal action.

Care For Sick and Injured Dogs

Veterinary knowledge and skill were limited until the First World War. People did not know how to treat the sicknesses and injuries suffered by animals. During the War, however, dogs and horses, so useful in the front line, were often wounded and needed first aid. Also, the submarine blockade of Britain made it necessary to protect the cattle herds used for food. So veterinaries were recruited for service on the home and battle fronts.

Conditions on the battlefields were appalling. There was an acute shortage of equipment and essential supplies. But many of the veterinaries were so dedicated to the cause of animal welfare that they amazed and impressed the soldiers. Lieutenant Paul George, a French Canadian, was such a man.

It was a cold, wet night in France. Patrols from the German and Allied sides had been very active, and they were both accompanied by dogs. When dawn broke, the German soldiers were still out and had suffered a few casualties. Eventually, when they managed to return to their own lines, they discovered that

the handler's German shepherd dog had been wounded and lost. The handler was very fond of his animal

and his comrades had great difficulty in preventing him from going back to search for it.

Shortly after returning to their own lines, troops in the Allied New Zealand sector heard moans coming.

Shortly after returning to their own lines, troops in the Allied New Zealand sector heard moans coming from No Man's Land. The officer in charge, realizing that they were being made by an animal, sent a message to the rear calling for a veterinary surgeon.

It was an hour before Paul George arrived. By then, all the men knew that the moans were coming from a dog, and that it could only be a German one, as none of theirs was missing. The New Zealand officer apologized to Paul saying, "There's no need to rescue a German dog."

But he was due for a surprise. Lieutenant Paul George had been a veterinary surgeon in his civilian occupation. He was one of the few "horse doctors", as they were called, and was kept very busy visiting sectors held by soldiers from many parts of the world. He regarded all animals as his friends, and felt that it was his duty to help them, regardless of whether they belonged to German or Allied troops.

Paul did not listen to the New Zealand officer's remarks. It was enough that he had heard the cry of an animal in distress. He took off his heavy overcoat and helmet, which he knew would get in his way, rolled up his sleeves, and picked up the canvas bag which held his medical supplies. Without a thought of danger, he climbed out of the trench and ran forward, keeping as low down as he could. He was used to finding animals, and soon he was moving in the direction of the dog's whimpers, ducking every now and then to avoid a stray shot.

The German officers were curious about the lone figure which they could see through their field glasses. What was the man holding in that bag? Was it grenades? Was he going to repair some wire on a trench? But why did he expose himself to such danger?

Just as they were about to open fire on him, the man disappeared down into a shell crater. They waited, ready for him to appear.

The delay puzzled them. Why was he taking so long, and what was he doing? Perhaps he was a man made crazy from shell shock!

Paul, of course, had found the dog. It tried to bark at him when he dropped into the crater, but the dog was too weak from a head wound. Fortunately, the bullet had only nicked open a large gash at the side of the head, and the dog was suffering mainly from loss of blood. Paul had somehow to clean the wound and then stitch the open skin together to reduce the bleeding. He would then try to stop the bleeding altogether by pressing on its neck.

The dog soon trusted him. Paul was a good doctor and was also strong. Even so, he was exhausted by the time he had finished his task, and had no sedative to give to the dog to calm it. If he could find its master then the dog, feeling safe would fall asleep.

There was no point in carrying the dog back to the Allied lines. Somehow, Paul had to make the Germans understand that their help was needed and that the Allied troops would cease fire for a while. So he tied a white bandage around his arm and waved another bandage above the crater. Both the New Zealand officer and the German officer were watching through their field glasses. Everything was quiet when Paul rose slowly above the crater. He could see the soldiers on both sides gazing in his direction.

He decided to stand upright and shout out the only German word he knew: "Kamerad!" Then he strolled determinedly toward the enemy lines. He had made a mental note of the dog's name and number which were on its collar. When he arrived at the German position he pointed back to the crater and kept repeating, "1,826 – Karl!"

At once understanding flashed across a corporal's face, and things began to move fast. The corporal called for the dog's handler. Then three men made their way toward the crater. As they drew near to Paul, the New Zealand officer and his orderly also climbed out of their trench. Soldiers from both sides were watching expectantly.

When finally Karl was lifted out, there was a storm, of whistling, clapping and cheering from both sides. After many handshakes, Paul returned to the Allied lines. He now knew that the dog was in safe hands again.

There was a sequel to this strange incident. One week later, white flags of truce were waved by the Germans. After a minute or so, a soldier and a German shepherd dog scrambled out of their dugout and walked up and down the line in full view of everyone. The applause was spontaneous. All the soldiers were glad that Karl was fit and well again.

The dog was cured because his wound had not been exposed too long, and the bleeding was stopped. Fifty years earlier a neglected injury would probably have proved fatal. There was no electricity for warmth and light, and neither antibiotics nor drugs. An animal had little chance of surviving a serious injury. Nowadays, the most extraordinary recoveries are made and nobody thinks anything of it.



JUDGING TIMES

FRIDAY 3rd June 2022

CONFORMATION: Vest collection from 7.00am. Judging commences at 8.00 am. Bitch Ring: SC Baby, Minor and Junior Bitches. Dog Ring: LSC Baby, Minor and Junior Bitches, then LSC Baby, Minor and Junior Dogs followed by SC Baby, Minor and Junior Dogs.

RALLY OBEDIENCE: Vetting 9.00-9.30 am. All judging commences at 10.00 am with Novice, Excellent followed by Advanced, Master. All place sashes, Excellent medals and mementos will be presented at the conclusion of the Trial. All class winners must attend the trophy presentations at completion of conformation judging on Sunday, 5th June 2022.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP – classes will be judged by Mr. Peter Hersant (QLD) during the lunch break. Ages 7 to under 10 years of age, 10 to under 13 Years of age, 13 to under 19 Years.

Entry and Photo Release forms available from Show Secretary showsecretary@qsdl.info or from the Show Secretary's office on the day.

Entry is free and must be handed to the Show Secretary by 11.00am on the day the Class is judged. Parents are reminded that your child must be able to control their dog. Parents must sign a release form on the day of competition failure to do so will see entry denied. All children must have control of the animal they are exhibiting. If any child cannot solely control (hold) the animal they are exhibiting they may be asked to leave the ring. No adults will be permitted in the ring.

SATURDAY 4th June 2022

CONFORMATION: Sires' Progeny assembly in the Bitch Ring at 7.15 am. Parade commences at 8.00 am in the Dog Ring, followed by Breeders' Groups. At the conclusion of the Breeders' Groups, judging of conformation classes will commence.

Bitch Ring: SC Puppy and Intermediate Bitches. **Dog Ring:** LSC Puppy and Intermediate Bitches followed by LSC Puppy and Intermediate Dogs, then SC Puppy and Intermediate Dogs.

OBEDIENCE: Vetting/check in from 8.00 to 8.30 am. All judging commences at 9.00 am with UD, UDX followed by CCD, Novice and Open. All place sashes, Excellent medals and mementos will be presented at the conclusion of the Trial. Winner of Winners will be judged on Sunday during the lunch break in the Dog Conformation ring (from CCD, Novice, Open, Utility & UDX class winners with qualifying scores). *All class winners must attend the trophy presentations at completion of conformation judging on Sunday, 5th June 2022. GSDCA Rules apply to all awards and gradings.

Judging in all rings to cease at 12.00 noon, for the Official Opening ceremony and presentation of GSDCA awards.

SUNDAY 5th June 2022

CONFORMATION: Commencing at 8.30am. Bitch Ring: SC Open Bitches. Dog Ring: LSC Open Bitches, LSC Open Dogs, SC Open Dogs, followed by all Challenges. *No Inter-sex or inter-variety judging. Gun testing will be conducted in all Open classes.

The 48th National Show & Trial trophy presentations will be held following the completion of judging.

Judging in both rings to cease at lunch time for the Winner of Winners Obedience competition, to be held in the Dog Ring.

Exhibitors please note: It is your responsibility to ensure you are ready when called to enter the ring. The exhibitor will be held responsible for the return of their allocated vests. Any vests not returned within 7 days of the event will incur a \$50.00 fee per unreturned vest. Only persons with 'Authorised Passes' will be permitted to enter the rings.

RETIRING ANIMALS

Animals eligible to retire at the National GSD Show and Trial will be: Gold, Silver & Bronze medal winners, National Challenge and Reserve Challenge winners and National GSD Show and Trial Class winners. (For further details refer to Section 35, National Show Manual on GSDCA website.)

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Conformation: Stock Coat and Long Stock Coat (ANKC classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, & 11 dogs/1a, 2a, 3a, 4a, 5a, 11a bitches) Baby Puppy – 3 months and under 6 months, Minor Puppy – 6 months and under 9 months, Puppy – 6 months and under 12 months, Junior – 9 months and under 18 months, Intermediate – 18 months and under 36 months, Open – 6 months and over. (Ages apply from the first day of the show, 3/6/2022).

SPECIAL CLASS REQUIREMENTS

Sires' Progeny Parade: Entry is automatic. A minimum of five progeny, aged nine months or over and entered in the Conformation Classes, both SC and LSC, will be automatically catalogued with the Sire's name and exhibit number. The Sire need not be present or entered in the show. The classes are noncompetitive but will receive commentary. Only sires classified under the GSDCA Breed Survey scheme are eligible. Exhibitor vests are not worn in the parade.

Breeders' Groups: Breeders' may enter as many teams as desired. All animals must carry the breeder's prefix and be of one coat variety. Each team must consist of 5 animals over 9 months of age from at least 2 sires and 2 dams. A separate entry form for each team must be received by the closing date of entries - no entry fee. Details of animals competing must be handed to the Show Secretary by close of judging on Friday 3rd June, 2022. All animals listed in a Breeder's Group must be entered in the show.

GSDCA Member Clubs Obedience Challenge: Teams of four exhibits compete, with the scores



gained in their respective classes within the National Trial. Exhibits can be mixed from different classes of obedience. Names of teams, handlers and dog's names must be provided to the Trial Manager prior to the commencement of the Trial. At least three of the exhibits must qualify. Exhibits entered in more than one class must nominate which class is to be scored. The winning team is that team which has the highest aggregate qualifying scores.

SPECIAL PRIZES

CONFORMATION - A Memorial plaque and trophy will be awarded to the winners of the following classes. The "Walter Reimann" memorial plaque to the Open Dog SC winner. 

GROUND RULES



These rules apply to all handlers during training sessions and have been formulated for the welfare of you and your dog.

Any Club member, or any person guilty of unseemly conduct or acts harmful to the club, may be asked to leave the Training area.

They may also be dealt with by the Committee of The GSDC of S A Inc. under clause 6, and relative bylaws of the Clubs Constitution.

Any dog which is sick WILL NOT be permitted onto the Club grounds.

Dogs who have suffered a CONTAGIOUS DISEASE WILL NOT be allowed on to the grounds until 5 weeks after being cleared by a veterinarian (a vets certificate may be required).

Puppies should not be brought out onto the Club grounds under the age of 8 weeks or at least 2 weeks after they have been inoculated for HEPATITIS, DISTEMPER AND PARVOVIRUS (vaccination certificate may be required).

Bitches in season are not permitted on the grounds unless at a recognised Club event. The use of switches, spiked collars or whips is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN ON THE CLUB GROUNDS.

Members shall not treat their dog in a manner which may reflect badly on the Club. Dogs are NOT to be taken off-lead or left unattended, except on the directives, or under the supervision of a Class Instructor.

The handlers of dogs which foul the Club grounds, will be responsible for cleaning up same, with the equipment provided. The Head Instructor has the authority to permit the use of a muzzle or training devices, as required in special cases. The use of the equipment is to be under supervision, and its use on the grounds, other than above, is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

Dogs under the age of 12 months ARE NOT permitted to use jump equipment higher than 400 mm, or longer than 800 mm.

Pursuant of the Health act "Dogs" ARE NOT permitted inside the Clubrooms. In the interest of safety and health, and in consideration of others, parents are required to supervise the behaviour of their children. The Clubrooms and Toilets MUST NOT be used as playing areas.

In the interests of public health the Clubrooms and the verandah area are NON-SMOKING areas.

Training Extreme Weather Policy Training will be cancelled if the forecast temperature for West Beach is predicted to be 37 degrees or above or an Extreme Storm warning is issued on www.eldersweather.com.au at 6pm the night before training (Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings).

Appropriate foot wear must be worn at ALL times when handling / double handling dogs on the Club grounds. Bare feet, thongs, slip on shoes, high heels, sandals or crocs and shoes with metal-spiked soles are not suitable foot wear and members wearing any of the above will be asked to leave the training area.
